

Dear Centenary family,

As previously announced in October, I have accepted the invitation of Pastor Becky and Shannon Boaz, our District Superintendent, to have the primary role of interim pastor beginning January 1. This will allow Pastor Becky to stay on as interim pastor, while also allowing her and Ken to take their annual January-March "retreat" in Florida. Pastor Becky will return as the primary interim pastor on April 1 and following that I will assist her in preparing our congregation for the receiving of a new full-time pastor July 1.

Officially I will be considered part-time. So, we are grateful that we will have a team of retired pastors already active in our congregation who will share in the responsibilities of preaching, leading worship, and pastoral care. But because we are all already active in the life of Centenary, we feel that we can have a sense of continuity and that our congregation will sense that as well. But we will continue to intentionally work on that and keep it as a priority.

While we will share preaching responsibilities, I will be the one working with our staff and lay leadership to assure we continue to live out our mission to "Love God, Love People, and Make Disciples," and our vision to "Love and Serve in the Streets of Shelbyville and the World." As I have attended the last several Operation Team and Church Council meetings, I can assure you that the lay leadership of these two teams already "get" this. And that excites me. My primary role will be to ask the right questions with our leadership and continue to encourage them.

The other thing that excites me is the positive momentum I sense within our congregation. Pastor Becky has done a marvelous job of restoring a positive self-image within us as a congregation. We are seeing new people in worship. And I have watched with joy as people in our congregation have welcomed them by more than a handshake and a "glad you are here." I have seen you sit with them and hear their stories and seek to be Christ to them. For you see, it is not that we need them, but they need us and the Savior and Lord we serve.

And one more exciting thing. We have all (especially Pastor Becky and the choir) been praying for God to send us the right person to consistently lead us in music. We think that prayer has been answered, and you will be hearing more about that.

Assistance Program

In November, Centenary received 18 requests for financial assistance and helped six families with rent or utilities at a cost of \$700.00. Our food assistance program distributed 148 bags of groceries, providing meals to 335 people. Malones of Louisville generously provided Thanksgiving meals on Thanksgiving Day for individuals who normally rely on our food assistance. Although things didn't go as originally planned, 80 meals were served by the end of the day.

Due to the way the holidays fell on the calendar this year, Thursday, December 19th, was the last day for food and financial assistance. This allows me to provide a report on the assistance program for December as well. I will do an end of year review for the February Crosstalk. In December, we received 15 applications for financial assistance and were able to assist nine of them at a total cost of \$1,226.03. For food assistance, we distributed 217 bags of groceries, including the Christmas dinner bags, which helped feed 498 people. On December 15th, Centenary assembled 54 Christmas dinner bags, all of which were distributed on December 17th.

The Christmas Shop was a great success again this year. Thanks to incredibly generous donations, we were able to assist 83 families with gifts for 206 children over three weeks. One 33-gallon bag of stuffed animals was left over and donated to the Shelbyville Police Department for officers to keep in their cars for children when needed. A bucket of clothes, hats, gloves, and some books was given to Southside's Family Resource Center. Amy Waggener also assembled several gift sets from remaining items, which she plans to deliver to the United Methodist Children's home.

I want to extend my heartfelt thanks to those who helped during assistance hours with the Christmas Shop and food distribution: Amy Waggener, Patsy Hughes, Diana Beaton, Dar Watts, and Nancy Angell.

This ministry would not be possible without the generous donations of funds, items, and time from our church family, community partners, and the prayers of so many. Together, we are making a difference in the lives of those who need it most. Our efforts are rooted in our mission to serve as Christ's hands and feet, sharing His love and hope with all who come through our doors. When we give, we demonstrate that God's love is alive and at work through us.




