

Assistance Program

This year has been marked by significant transition and uncertainty. For many of the individuals seeking our assistance, such instability is a constant reality. Numerous households are precariously balanced, with a single illness or injury potentially leading to financial distress. The impacts of inflation and the shortage of affordable housing are profoundly affecting many lives. Astonishingly, some of our clients are paying more in rent for a two-bedroom apartment than I do for my house mortgage. The escalating prices at grocery stores and other retailers exacerbate the struggle, leaving many people in dire circumstances.

Our records show a growing number of individuals who previously managed are now struggling to make ends meet. By the end of June, Centenary received 80 applications for financial assistance. We were able to directly assist 44 of these households, positively impacting 85 individuals at a total cost of \$6,899.77.

What stands out and is particularly concerning is that of the remaining 36 households, 20 had been assisted within the past 12 months, 12 did not return with the necessary paperwork, and 4 had not completed the required financial counseling courses. It is not uncommon for individuals to seek assistance before the 12-month period is up but seeing 25% of applications or requests falling into this category is both surprising and disheartening. The level of need within our community is indeed alarming and heartbreaking.

On the food assistance front, Centenary has distributed 784 bags of food so far this year, serving 1,677 individuals. Dare to Care has generously donated 15,932 pounds of food, valued at approximately \$25,013.24. Additionally, we received around 200 pounds of highquality lean ground beef from Farmers Feeding Families. Centenary has also spent \$1,546.23 on food and other essential items for the food assistance program.

In these challenging times, many people turn to faith for support. Churches are often seen as a sanctuary and a source of help, reflecting our Christian commitment to be like Christ in serving those in need. As Pope Francis said, "You pray for the hungry. Then you feed them." Let us all pray for the individuals in our community who seek our help and then work to meet their basic needs.

Let's embody our vision: To be changed by Christ, to love and serve, in the streets of Shelbyville and the world. We continue our mission to: Love God. Love People. Make Disciples.

The assistance program is open to ALL Shelby County residents.

Assistance days are Tuesdays and Thursdays 9:00am-1:00pm.

For finical assistance people must bring: Photo ID, proof of income, current disconnect notice or lease agreement. Assistance is available once in a 12month time frame.

Food assistance can be picked up every other week. Just need and ID showing Shelby County residency.

I'm going to be planning events to start in September again so that you will have a few weeks to adjust to your classes and schedule. IF YOU HAVE SUGGESTIONS FOR EVENTS, THEN I WANT TO HEAR FROM YOU! This is your ministry and you always have a say in what we do together, just send me your ideas. I'm looking at a possible day-hike for a Saturday this fall while the leaves are colorful, possibly October or November. I know some of you attend school further away...so if you give me advance notice of your visits home, I am willing to plan additional events during those weekends too. I'm still putting together dates, so...high school graduates from the class of 2020 forward, make sure you are on the look-out for text message invites from me and join in on the fun! Make sure I have your number! If you are the parent of one of our college-age young adults and you haven't heard them mention any text invites...feel free to send me their information. I want to keep them all engaged as much as possible.

Church family, I ask you to please be in prayer for us as we work to grow a greater outreach to our college-age young adults. I'm excited about this opportunity and believe that the response from the kiddos will continue to be positive.

We can keep in touch with them, letting them know that we continue to keep them in our prayers. We can keep in touch with them, asking if they have something they specifically would like for us to pray for them about that week. We can keep in touch with them, checking to see how their classes are going and how they are adjusting to campus and living with their roommates. We can keep in touch with them, letting them know that we want to see them when they are in town from campus. We can keep in touch with them, letting them know what is happening at Centenary that they may want to come home to see or participate in occasionally. We can keep in touch with them, asking if they have found a church to attend near campus or a Bible study group to join. We can keep in touch with them, asking about mission trip and retreat opportunities they have participated in through a campus group. I've been amazed and blessed to hear some of their stories from campus involvement. It can bring tears to your eyes and joy to your heart as you hear what God is continuing to do in their lives and through their willingness to be God's hands and feet and voice to their peers.

I have informational forms being distributed to our college kids (yes, I said kids because they are still my kids even though they are taller than me and many of them are no longer teenagers). Very soon, I will be asking for volunteers to step up as Barnabas Pal Sponsors. While I do not have all of the forms back to have a final count of college kids needing to be paired with a sponsor, I believe we will have around a dozen students needing to be paired with a Barnabas Pal Sponsor.
